# 6. City Consultations (Jeff)

- See the email attachment or meeting handout for a list of current consultations, links to more information, and opportunities to submit feedback.
- Highlights of current consultations; gaps and issues raised recently in comms from HUB members:
  - Yukon at King Edward (jog in Yukon) City is planning protected bike lanes on King Edward from Yukon to Heather. We will ask that they extend to Yukon southbound from King Edward.
  - Ontario and 37<sup>th</sup> St (traffic circle) Two downhills mean many people are moving quickly through this circle. It's difficult to say how to improve this area.
  - Nanaimo and CVG (traffic signal timing) You cannot use the opposing crosswalk signal countdown timer as your cue to move forward. Diversions needed at Nanaimo?
  - Pine and 7<sup>th</sup> (traffic volume) Requested diversion at Fir St should help address this issue.
  - Width of bike lanes (consideration of cargo bikes for minimum lane width) usually depends on available space. No legal standard.
  - Bike parking request for more secure bike parking around town. Possible app for bike parking?
  - Adanac bike route at Kaslo (proposed sports complex development) local residents are concerned about parking with the new complex. HUB will ask City how they plan to mitigate traffic in this area if the development moves ahead.
  - Adanac overpass (at Cassiar) closed for period of construction on 1<sup>st</sup> Ave. (Close/re-open to motor vehicles?) Mixed opinions in the neighbourhood. HUB will be asking the City about their plans for the overpass.
  - Arbutus Greenway at King Edward (signal timing, phasing) Three recent near misses by vehicles turning right on red, or SB turning left. Need separate phasing of lights? Or possible

separate crossing for the Greenway, offset from Arbutus St (as at Broadway)?

- NB Carrall at Pacific (requirement for push button) There is a bike sensor in the pavement!
- Collingwood at 37<sup>th</sup> (jog in Ridgeway bike route) discussed, not felt to be an issue.
- Elliot St south to SE Marine Dr (traffic volume and speed) possible issue. Will discuss with CoV.

### 7. In Depth – Elections Issues (Facilitated by Lisa)

- Non-partisan discussion; HUB does not endorse candidates, but this is an opportunity to provide information on candidates especially with respect to their positions on active transportation.
- Comment that our approach for sharing candidates' responses, was felt to be difficult to review and understand. Lots of candidates to review.
- Google group set up for discussing candidates. See Lisa to be added.
- "Price Tags" Gordon Price is keeping track of those candidates that have responded to HUB's survey.
- HUB has policies in place to reach out to newly elected individuals and offer information on bike issues following the election.

- HUB is expanding their research, and undertaking a project to catalog and map all bike routes in Greater Vancouver. Currently there is no standard approach to documenting bike routes across the region.
- Will start doing research on this information. HUB plans to publish annual or semi annual benchmarking report. Bike route data can be used with crash data, mode share data, etc, to understand impacts of new cycling infrastructure.

## 10. Active Transportation and Policy Council (Lisa)

- Citizen advisory council that advises City staff on active transportation issues. If you are interested, anyone is welcome to attend and be involved on sub committees. Minutes are posted online.
- ATPC has been dissolved (as usual) in advance of the upcoming election.
