Updates from Working Groups				
Assessment Rides (Jeff, Philippe)	 Assessment rides are reviews of existing or potential bike routes within the City of Vancouver (CoV). Reports are generated and posted on our wiki. Our reports are used to advocate with municipal officials and provide them with recommendations. We finalized the assessment ride reports for the Dumfries Bikeway, the Central Valley Greenway, the Ontario Bikeway, and the temporary protected lanes in Stanley Park. The reports were approved, and were published on our wiki. Assessment ride of Richards St and Smithe St planned 	Philippe: Plan a ride for Richards and Smithe		
Cycling in Parks (Lisa)	 Stakeholder engagement sessions scheduled re the recommended path options through Kits Beach Park. More details under Consultations. Park Board report due on the Phase 2 consultation for path improvements at Kits Beach Park. John Hendry Park renewal plan consultation report due Regular meeting with PB staff scheduled. 			
Arbutus Greenway (Stan)	 Former railway line from the Fraser River through to 1st Ave at Granville St. Easy grade through some very scenic areas with easy access to shops and services. Design work underway on the intersection of the AG and King Edward, also some planning for the intersection at 41st. 			
Urban Cargo and Delivery (Sam)	 This working group is looking at promoting the adoption of cargo bikes for last km delivery services, focusing on enabling policies as well as infrastructure issues. No update this month. 			
Broadway Subway (Jeff)	 Construction updates are being received from the project office and published through our social media feeds. Anthony attended the Traffic Advisory Group meeting. Some issues on Cypress near Broadway with parked vehicles blocking cycling access. 			
East Van Greenway (Clark)	 The creation of a north-south greenway in East Vancouver, eventually connecting Burrard Inlet to the Fraser River. No update this month. 			
Municipal Election (Kay for Lisa)	 This new working group is preparing for the 2022 municipal election. Work includes creating a voting history record for incumbents and drafting questions that will be posed to all candidates, with the responses published. Attendee suggestions for questions we should ask all candidate were entered in the chat 			

7. Consultations (Jeff)

- The City has approved licensing for <u>Quadricycle tours</u>. These vehicles will not be operated in cycle lanes. Potential competition for the Stanley Park horse drawn carriages.
- Climate Emergency Action Plan to be aligned with the 2023-2026 Capital Plan <u>Motion passed</u>. This means that all capital investment plans for the next budget cycle should be shown to be supportive of our GHG emission reduction targets.
- <u>Kits Beach Park</u> Consultation continues on new path options. Park Board stakeholder meetings scheduled for Feb 17th and 23rd. We support the PB staff recommendations for the routing of the

new paths. We have several recommendations for details of the design, including painted crossings, physical separation with a low curb on the portion of the path aligned with Yew St, a raised crossing at the parking lot entrance at the north end of Arbutus, etc. We also want to see the CoV put a protected bidirectional lane on the north side of Ogden, and for the Park Board to address the remaining gap in Zone 4. It is critical that commissioners and staff hear support for these proposed improvements. More project details here. Please complete this survey by Comms will be going out via HUB social media feeds as well to encourage people to fill out the survey and show their support.

- The opportunity to improve pavement markings on local street bikeways was discussed. Eric proposed that these routes be marked with a bike symbol on a green background, to further emphasize that bikes belong on these streets. We will follow up with CoV Engineering.
- <u>New Coal Harbour School</u> Judicial decision dismissed the petition to revoke the development permit. Transportation Assessment and Management Study released.
- Translink 2050 Transportation Plan has been adopted
- Coming soon for public engagement:
 - <u>Bute St Greenway</u> Consultation held on a proposed Shore to Shore greenway, with new public plazas Initial concepts expected Spring 2022.
 - Draft Broadway Plan Report to be released Feb 28
 - Oakridge property development Public Hearing March 1st
 - John Hendry Park Renewal Plan launched. This park includes a section of the BC Parkway, a key active transportation connection. Revised draft plan expected early 2022.
 - No date yet for public engagement for the Portside Greenway Improvements. We will continue to monitor this. <u>Greenway plan here.</u>
