- HUB Cycling's <u>Bike to Shop</u> event runs from Aug 13-21. Registration is free
- We attended the Concord Pacific family <u>Cycling Festival</u> on June 30th, with a HUB Cycling tent and two shifts of volunteers. This was a chance to engage with the public, represent HUB Cycling, answer questions, and hand out free maps. Thanks to all the volunteers who helped out.
- HUB Cycling staff presented an all committee workshop on Wednesday July 6th at the Trout Lake Community Centre and online. The workshop focused on emerging paradigms in roadway and bikeway design and implications for Cycling Advocacy, including road space reallocation, and built on our previous NACTO workshops on bikeway design. - HUB Cycling has established a base at the Trout Lake Recreation Centre for <u>Streetwise cycling</u> <u>courses</u>, as well as <u>partnering with Spinal Cord Research BC</u> on services for adaptive cycling.
- Colin Stein has completed his book on the <u>history of cycling advocacy in Vancouver</u>. Several of our committee members are referenced. The book will be released July 25th, and <u>Colin's website</u> also has the material that formed the basis of the book.
- Translink has launched their <u>Bike Bus</u> service, connecting Bridgeport station with the Tsawwassen ferry terminal. Hourly departures on Fridays, weekends, and holidays, through this summer.

Park Board Commissioners accepted the <u>interim report</u>, and endorsed the 7 guiding principles put forward by staff, on July 20, after the July 19 meeting was shut down due to heckling from protesters.</li> </ul>	
Arbutus Greenway (Stan)	<ul> <li>Former railway line from the Fraser River through to 1st Ave at Granville St. Easy grade through some very scenic areas with easy access to shops and services.</li> <li>Design work continues for the intersection of the AG and King Edward, as well as consideration of 16th and 41st.</li> <li>The CoV has received requests to reinstate the washrooms.</li> </ul>

# 6. Consultations (Jeff)

- Fatality at Pacific and Hornby in the protected intersection. Agustin Beltran was hit by a truck in a marked crossing on July 29th, and died at the scene. We reviewed the incident, our response, and the next steps, including our support for a motion by Councillors Bligh and Boyle to require truck side guards on CoV and CoV contractor trucks, in addition to other steps. This motion goes to council on July 19th, and we requested your support in messages to council. Subsequent to this meeting, Council unanimously approved the motion on July 20th.
- Stanley Park interim cycle lanes, and the <u>Stanley Park Mobility Study</u>. Read the <u>Staff Report here</u>. The PB Commissioner meeting on July 18th was ended due to heckling from the crowd. The meeting resumed on July 19th with only one speaker admitted to the meeting room at a time. Speakers were heard, and the motion to accept the report and endorse the 7 guiding principles was passed 5-2, with commissioners Coupar and Barker against. We discussed the NPA campaign to "Take Back Stanley Park" and remove the cycle lanes without waiting for the report. The importance of electing PB commissioners supportive of active transportation was discussed.
- <u>The Vancouver Plan</u> has been released. We are encouraged to see references to active transportation, including to shops and services, in the plan. More details in the presentation. The plan is now being considered by Council.
- Oakridge development plans for cycling access to local bikeways. <u>Design Guidelines</u> were considered by city council on July 19th and 20th.
- More details on these and other current consultations in the presentation.

# 7. Regional Advisory Committee (RAC) Update (Jeff)

• The RAC has plans to promote the requirement for truck side guards with other Metro Vancouver municipalities, regional authorities, provincial authorities, and trucking companies.

# 8. Board Update (Jeff)

• HUB Cycling will hold the 2022 AGM on September 29th. Voting for directors is open to all HUB Cycling members, and will be conducted on line the week prior to the AGM. This is an opportunity to support board candidates who are involved in advocacy. Applications for board positions are open through July and August.

#### 10. Other Business

- The Park Board meeting re the Stanley Park Mobility Study, and the City of Vancouver council meeting, were both running concurrently with tonight's meeting, and prompted regular comments and discussion.
- We have followed up on recent submissions to the CoV, and will report back when we have information on additional pavement markings on local street bikeways, parking meter removal, and other topics.
- We have invited the CoV to attend an upcoming meeting and present on active transportation topics. City staff were not ready this month, but have agreed to attend this fall, and have suggested that in addition to an AT projects update, they would like to discuss a new approach to neighbourhood traffic management. We expect that this will be of great interest to our local committee members.
- We did consider holding a face to face meeting in July, with a social ride afterwards, but after much discussion decided to stay with the virtual format, considering current infection trends. We know there are opinions on both sides of this issue. We will continue to monitor the situation and plan meetings accordingly.
- We are planning a local committee social ride for August (there is no meeting scheduled for August). This will be a chance to talk with and see other local committee members face to face, on a relaxed ride, likely involving Beach Ave and Stanley Park. Details to follow.
