- 3. The 216 Street interchange is nearing completion. Landscaping and signage installation has been taking place this week. Township has not yet addressed our concerns which we submitted earlier this fall. Geraldine has sent a letter with pictures to Jerry Fleming at Binnie Engineering and James Lee at ToL Engineering showing that newly planted trees obscure the recently installed signage. Green paint and strategically placed bollards would go a long way to making this corridor safer for cyclists. It is unfortunate that HUB Langley must keep pushing ToL to implement best practices.
- 4. Sarah was not present to discuss social rides.
- Of the 10 candidates in the B.C. election who received our questions, only 3 responded.
  HUB Langley thanks the NDP and Green candidates for taking time to respond to our questions.
- Our committee is considering the purchase of one or two feather banners for use at public events. The banners would feature the HUB logo at the top with HUB Langley printed vertically. Mitch will ask Navdeep if HUB can survey other committees for interest in a bulk purchase.
