

# Surrey – White Rock Committee Meeting Minutes

Meeting call to order: 735 PM followed by group introductions.

- 1. **Protected Cycling Network** Peter Klitz went through a PowerPoint on behalf of the City of Surrey. These are the highlights:
  - Surrey has 0.4% cycling mode share. They feel that this low share rate is based on the lack of protected bike lanes.
  - Of the bike roadway these are the stats:
    - o 23% MUP
    - o 8 % neighborhood bikeway
    - o 2 % protected lanes
    - o 67% no protection/shared road/painted bike lane
  - The city wants to build a dense network of protected bike lanes around the Surrey Six town centres.
  - They also want to invest in the SkyTrain connection and cycling network.
  - King George between 96<sup>th</sup> Ave and 108 Ave has the highest cycling collision rate.
  - Protected bike lanes will be built due to road widening/finishing projects, capital projects (e.g., quick build) and redevelopment.
  - North Surrey is the primary focus as it has the densest population of Surrey and is a major destination.
  - The city is looking at a bike share service but without protected bike lane infrastructure it would not be successful.
  - The City of Surrey has six loop detections systems to identify bike usage. Transit has 2 more systems.
  - They have been working on providing more bike information:
    - o Updated bike map
    - o Updated content on website

- o Supporting bike education and training
- o Improving signage (wayfinding) for cyclists
- o Participate in Car Free Day to enhance community profile
- City has gotten a federal grant for the King George 96 to 108th Ave improvement project. This is a 6-million-dollar grant. Project phase Spring 2023 to March 2026.
- The city has been doing a safety review for cycling for this project. Items cover are:
  - o Curb extension
  - o Widen sidewalk
  - o Upgrade to signals
  - o Improve lighting
