7. Guest Speaker: Paul Krueger, City of Vancouver on the Portside Greenway

Paul reviewed the current state of the Portside Greenway, thoughts about how it could be improved, and issues surrounding the project. Currently, the project is broken into four sections: Alexander, Powell, Wall, and Bridgeway. The most difficult, and perhaps most important section is the one between McLean and Semlin. Paul discussed each section in detail. Suggestions from the committee included: making a new park at Heatley; painting the Powell St overpass barriers with a mural; converting Powell St to 3 lanes of motor vehicle traffic with a centre counterflow lane so that a bidirectional separated mobility lane could be included; a pull-out on the Powell St overpass to enjoy the view; moving the bus to Pandora; making Powell wider on the south side of the street and shifting the lanes; creating a bike path south of the tracks but north of the buildings on Powell; creating more parks across Wall St like on Pt Grey Road; and better signage and wayfinding. 8. Advocacy Principles (Anthony)

We reviewed the advocacy principles again, added one with respect to safe and secure bike parking and end-of-trip facilities. We had more discussion about the term "avid cyclists" and decided to replace it with "fast, confident cyclists". There was discussion to explicitly state "All ages and abilities are the priority" or similar. Also discussion that separation should be between all modes, not just bikes and cars. And to be sure to avoid "cyclists", using "people on bikes" instead. Another principle was suggested: direct routes, not winding routes. **The principles will be finalized at the next meeting.**

9. Groups.io (Anthony)

We discussed switching from Google Groups as an email list to "groups.io". Groups.io is used by the parent HUB Cycling organization and VULC members have missed some emails from staff. Further, groups.io allows members to subscribe to certain topics like volunteer opportunities, special events, particular working groups, etc. However, new members to groups.io are set to receive just special announcements, so nothing will change for people who don't want change, other than receiving email from a different source address, and receiving a low volume of email from HUB staff. Groups. Io will further empower members to discuss their own topics with other members, so that there can be discussion outside of the monthly meetings. Lastly, groups.io also has a web interface for those who prefer the "forums" experience. It even supports RSS https://hubcycling.groups.io/g/vancouver-ubc/rss. Consensus was this move was a good thing, so Anthony will begin the process before the next meeting.
