Notes

 Colin Stein (HUB's Director of Marketing Communications & Campaigns) gave updates related to referendum, head office activities, RAC, 2015 campaigns, etc. Discussed the fact that the majority of voters in Maple Ridge/Pitt Meadows area are not supportive of the referendum and see it more as an opportunity to vote against Translink on governance and executive over-compensation and spending issues. Local residents don't think they're getting what they're paying for and don't want to pay any more. Explained our position and why we're mostly trying to stay out of the discussion.

Staff was asked to look at possible solutions for Brown Ave. As to the development on 123 Ave. at McKenney Creek, apart from our concerns wrt cyclist safety (dip in the road and narrow section) there were various concerns re traffic both on 123 Ave. and 207A St., environmental set-backs etc. from residents in the area which the developer has been asked to address.
- We're going to continue to meet throughout the summer for now. If there aren't any pressing issues at the time, we can always decide to skip a meeting closer to the date.
- HUB MR/PM priorities for 2015. Didn't have time to go through BAC Business Plan 2013 2017 and prioritize + add items, so this will be back on agenda for Feb. meeting.
