## 6. Granville Connector – Preferred Option presented by Paul Krueger, CoV Engineering Team

- The preferred option is for the West Side +, with a bidirectional cycling path on the Fir off ramp to 10th.
- Support will be required to get this project approved, it isn't a done deal
- Due to costs, projected to be above the \$25m capital budget already approved, some phasing may be required. Council vote expected in the coming months.
- Workshops: Feb 1 and 4. Open House: Jan 24<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup>, and 28<sup>th</sup>. Online Survey available. Details in the Current Consultations attachment.

## 7. Consultations

- See the email attachment or meeting handout for a list of current consultations, links to more information, and opportunities to submit feedback
- Robson Village Workshop attended in November. Opportunity for public space improvements, reduced vehicle traffic flow, etc.
- Meeting held with Port of Vancouver on the Gateway Strategy. Primary impact is the elimination of at grade rail crossings. 40 projects identified; 20 of these are now underway and funded.
- Meeting held with the NEFC Engineering team on street design. Project has advanced significantly. Most streets include protected bike lanes. Phased construction planned; timing will be somewhat dependent on pace of land development work (must be coordinated due to land swaps).
- 750 Pacific Blvd Development Permit Plaza of Nations. Community Open House coming up Feb 3<sup>rd</sup>; important to push for cycling paths along the seawall (Seaside Greenway). See the list of current consultations for details.
- Dunsmuir Connection open houses coming up Jan 25<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> see the progress on the proposed active transportation ramp from Creekside Park to Dunsmuir St.
- Drake St final phase of consultation commenced. Open Houses coming up Feb 6<sup>th</sup>. Opposition to this project was voiced in the first phase, by residents concerned about access. The CoV has worked to refine the design. This project is important and will need your support. This isn't just an important east-west connector, but it also provides access to the Granville Connector
- Richards St construction underway. Cordova to Nelson due to be completed by summer 2020. Nelson to Pacific due to be completed by spring 2021. Includes an additional block on Pacific from Richards to Seymour.

- Interim improvements planned for the Ontario Bikeway (2<sup>nd</sup> to Broadway) and the intersection of Ontario and 16<sup>th</sup>, in the first half of 2020.
- Public engagement planned by the CoV for the Bute Greenway in Q2 of 2020
