Arbutus Greenway (Stan)	 In the past, Park Board staff and Commissioners have focused on "bike to the park", but not "bike IN the park": "To, not Through" strategy. We have requested a Park Board motion clarifying this issue (Bikes to AND through). Letter writing and public campaign was launched to encourage elected commissioners to acknowledge the deficiencies in the VanPlay 25-year strategy, and to adopt To AND Through as a design principle. 500 people wrote letters and Park Board took notice. We now have quarterly meetings with PB staff and first meeting was held last week. VanPlay Report was one of the main topics of this meeting. Engineering staff from City is also attending, which is a significant benefit We have revived the new draft of the VanPlay Report and made suggestions that were accepted by Park Board We will inform the committee once the final draft is ready Stanley Park and Kits Seaside update: Jeff and Anthony did a reconnaissance walk through with City and Park staff to review plans for summer 2019. Not a lot of progress anticipated this year. Former railway line from the Fraser River through to 1st Ave at Granville St. Easy grade through some very
	 scenic areas with easy access to shops and services. Met with City staff and updates include: removal of foliage to clear path. Submitted all our reports to city staff for the new working team at City Hall
	 Awaiting signal upgrade planned for Arbutus at King Edward (restricted left turn, and no right turn on red) Ron suggested a meeting in August to discuss working group plans, time and date TBC.
	Planning for Arbutus connector to Seaside greenway (via Pine St.) has been pushed to next year.

Cycling Logistics (Sam)	 This working group is looking at promoting the adoption of cargo bikes for last km delivery services, focusing on enabling policies as well as infrastructure issues. Update on the International Cargo Bike Festival, and the European Cycle Logistics conference in Dublin Cargo Bikes come in variety of sizes and shapes and can move good and people In order to get cargo bikes to replace trucks/cars. municipalities need to create policies, pedestrian focused streets and provide incentives. Cycling industry needs to adopt to succeed in this category. Path forward should include: regulations, Infrastructure and mini hubs, adaptation for B2B

- This is a planned multi use path linking First Nations communities, generally along the shore
- Led by Tsawwassen Elder Ruth Adams
- Involving other HUB Cycling local committees, and the HUB Regional Advisory Committee
- Arbutus Greenway has been identified as a potential link
- Also passes through Stanley Park, West End beaches, Vanier Park, Kits Beach Park, Jericho, through UBC parks, and along SW Marine to the Canada Line bridge at Cambie.
- Opportunity to promote this with the CoV, and Vancouver Parks Board, as well as MoTI.
