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Delta HUB WHO are we?

WHAT are our Provincial Priorities?

- Our members have generated a detailed Spot Improvement List, which lists key fixes for the Province in the following areas:
 - Debris Clearing
 - Signage
 - Safety Hazards
 - Infrastructure
 - Inter-governmental Coordination





Provincial Priorities

Examples: Debris Clearing

- Eastbound Ladner Trunk Road over Hwy 91
 - Heavy brush; cyclists can't see vehicles, and vice-versa
- Hwy 17A and Hwy 17 SFPR
 - Loose gravel and debris is regularly found on paved shoulder



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Provincial Priorities (cont'd)

Examples: Signage

- Hwy 17 and 28 Avenue
 - Suggest sign/map info point at Highway 17 and 28th Avenue to show alternate cycling routes to Highway 17
- Mainroad Shuttle Drop-off at Town & Country
 - Suggest signage to inform cyclists about local route options





Provincial Priorities (cont'd)

Examples: Safety Hazards

- Intersection at Hwy 17 and 52nd St
 - Conflict area requires mitigation: suggest green paint; pedestrian overpass
- Highway Construction Zones
 - Warning signs are often in bike lanes, forcing cyclists into traffic;
 - Requires policy to always consider cyclists and pedestrians





Provincial Priorities (cont'd)

Examples: Infrastructure

- George Massey Tunnel Replacement Project (GMTR)
 - Safe and efficient connections from bridge/corridor to key network routes (including River Rd., Vasey Rd., 64 St, Burns Dr., Hwy 10)
 - Maintain separated Millennium Trail greenway and key linkages
- Hwy 17 (SFPR)
 - Northbound cyclists must exit
 SFPR at 72 St to avert Hwy
 10/Hwy 99 exits
 - Mitigation is required on 72 St due to truck traffic/road width





Provincial Priorities (cont'd)

Examples: Inter-Governmental Coordination

64 St Connections

 With the GMTR, SFPR, and Truck Staging Facility, 64 St will become a more important alternative, requiring linkages and signage

Other GMTR-Related Connections

 The new bridge exits, transit exchange, and overpasses along the Hwy 99 corridor represent key opportunities to forge safer and more efficient cycling connections
