1. Welcome & Introductions

Check-in- name, pronouns; Call to order for May Agenda, new items welcome.

2. Review & Approval of Minutes for Previous Meeting

Minutes for April 2023 meeting.

3. Items for Discussion

- <u>SalmonFest 2023</u> Michael Patrick from the Steveston Community Centre occurring Sat.
 July 1st, returning for first time since pandemic.
 - Seeking booth partners. There may be a bike valet, so we could be placed next/near that.
 - o Could do a member drive, hand out swag, promote bike education.
 - 6 hour day (11:00 to 17:00); may need shifts
 - Roads closed at 9 AM due to parade, but possibly work-aroundable. Need to work out logistics.
- <u>ParticipACTION Community Challenge</u> June 2nd at Thompson Community Centre,
 4PM to 6PM. Near Railway Greenway.
 - Looking for volunteers to hand out flyers, member drive, signatures for Steveston MUP?, etc. .
 - Maybe ask Mike from Krusty's for bike tuneups?
 - Note: Conflicts with HUB Celebration Station at Canada Line Bikeway on River Rd which occurs at same time.

- Discussion of Steveston MUP controversy and actions to support it
 - o Summary of public feedback so far:

- Some people think it's just a painted bike lane and think the cost is unreasonable as a result
- Render on Nextdoor post is not particularly representative doesn't show separation from motor traffic
- Air quality came up as a concern
- Summary of overall budget status:
 - MUP project is from Shell to Railway. Original budget was approved several years ago, including this year's ~\$2.8M for Phase 3 (from No. 2 to Railway).
 - Additional \$2.8M coming from Translink (who provides 50% cost share)
 - Phase 1 and 2 have finished detailed design, went to tender, but bids all came back over-budget. Report in March asked to accommodate this by asking City Council to increase the budget by ~\$2.5M, and City Council told Staff to investigate Williams Rd as an alternative (which is where we're now).
 - Phase 3 is undergoing a redesign.
- Potential for rapid implementation:
 - Between No. 2 and Railway there's a left turn lane. If that got reallocated, plus lane narrowing (i.e. repainting lines), there should be enough space freed up on road surface for a MUP + concrete barrier protection, without need for any relocation of obstacles/utilities (since pre-existing road surface is being used)
 - <u>Translink Rapid Implementation Guidelines</u> suggests concrete barriers cost \$0.5~1M per km, and Phase 3 is <1 km. So possibly could save the City \$1M or more?
 - Translink dashboard shows that this section of road is never congested, even during rush hour
 - Rapid implementation would also speed up actual construction, making up for lost time from these delays.
 - Only disadvantage identified is that by doing this, we'd lose some funding from Translink due to cost-share structure. But City would still save money, and funding could be gotten in future from an upgrade project
 - Council seems to be OK with pushing back against motorists e.g. speed limit reductions, automatic camera enforcement
 - Would be great optics for us we're working with Council to reduce costs

- Jesse is meeting with Richmond Centre for Disability tomorrow (May 12) to try to garner their support
- Air quality doesn't seem to be a concern Amy (air quality scientist) says benefits from cycling outweigh those from air quality
- We need to collate all of the reasons we want the Steveston MUP project (and for it to be on Steveston instead of Williams)
 - List them here
- Bike Rack Campaign update (Predag, Jesse)
 - No update since Predrag isn't here
- Great Blue Heron Way (Sheryl)
 - Progress is slow, but going
 - Council had motion on May 1 to hire Indigenous Relations manager, mirroring other municipalities
 - Council can't readily acknowledge tribes due to lawsuit around Garden City Lands
- Events Committee; debrief on Advance Your Ride and Ride Marshaling Courses (Donna, Anna)
 - Covered how to organize and guide a group ride, various safety things around it,
 e.g. maneuvering in traffic, taking the lane, taking left turns
- Summer Ride Some options brought up.
 - Doors Open Richmond maybe we can publish a recommended bike route for this event?
 - Garlic Festival is Aug. 20 could aim for that again?
 - June is the Island City Bike Tour
- Richmond Active Transportation Committee: no updates next RATC meeting May 17th
