BIKE BC Funding - deadline is Feb 18. > reach out to muni's and make sure that they are submitting projects that will help complete the network in your muni and not just a random bike path. Push for AAA projects only.

ADOPT A GAP: 80 GAPS were adopted across Metro Vancouver in the month on November alone. Andrew emailed LC's list of GAPs adopted in each municipality. Committees will follow up with Muni as well as the adoptee.

BIKE AWARDS: 6th Annual Bike Awards will be held on Thursday, February 28, 2019, at Vancouver Public Library. Arno will be recognized at the awards and a Lifetime Achievement Award has been established in his memory.

MVA Reforms: Erin has been proactively reaching out to MLA to push for MVA reforms.

Alex will update the draft to include Great Blue Heron Way to the RAC priority list. Alex, Roel and Stephen will work on this and will keep RAC updated on progress.

Focus on YVR Sea Island. Also working on the progress on River Road. Volunteer wants to do a social media campaign to increase capacity and will reach out to Navdeep to follow up
