 - Short term is No 2 rd to Shell Rd. Phase 3 would be connecting the Railway greenway (Railway to Shell). Still needs to be looked at is Shell to Hwy 99 (to connect with Steveston Interchange)
 - Should be located on south side, hopefully with more crossings to north side
 - No. 2 Rd MUP in very early planning stage. More to come next meeting
