- e. Tony participated in a Zoom meeting with cameron Perkin, Infrastructure Engineer, Langley City. Major points discussed were:
 - HUB to offer input on Langley City Master Transportation Plan update.
 - · Secure end of trip bike parking.
 - Cylcing infrasctructure/facilities in center of city.
- f. March 14 HUB Zoom meeting: Possibility of Cycle Highways. HUB report to be made available to committees by end of March. These cycle highways will eventually link lower mainland municipalities and extend into the Fraser Valley. It is crucial that municipalities establish common criteria for the bike highways so that there is contistency for end users whether they are in West Vancouver or Abbotsford.
- g. Secure end of trip bike parking. John will spearhead our mission to bring secure end of trip parking to Langley. Discussions will continue with Langley Memorial Hospital this spring. This issue will also be addessed with local government and business leaders.
- h. The Brookswood Fernridge Neighborhood Plan was released for public input until March 21. John prepared a submission in which he shared our concerns regarding the shortcomings of the proposed Road and Cycling Networks. This committee's recent report on 40 Avenue deficiencies at Murray Creek was included in the submission.
- i. HUB Langley's 2022 Action Plan was submitted earlier this month.
 - Continue to engage with TOL and MoTI regarding current infrastructure projects such as 216 Street, 40 Avenue and freeway overpasses.
 - Advocate for end-of-trip secure bike parking in Langley.
 - Continue community outreach through articles in local media, BTSW, GBWK, and participation in community events wherever practical during Covid19.
- j. Findings of the 216 Street Phase 2 Corridor Study were shared with Township council December 9, 2021. I appears that Township Council will implement minimal improvements on 216 Street from 88 - 96 Avenues in the near term. Given that we are in an election year, this committee will develop a strategy to engage with all prospective candidates in Langley Township concerning 216 Street and other key bike routes.
