Updates from Working Group		
Assessment Rides (Jeff)	 Assessment rides are reviews of existing or potential bike routes within the City of Vancouver (CoV). Reports are generated and posted on our wiki. 14th Ave through the Health precinct, and Pender Corridor are next up for review. 	Jeff and Anthony to schedule rides as noted above.
	 Recommendation to start requesting a response from the City to ensure that they have reviewed the information/report we provide to them. 	
Seaside South (Lisa)	 Scope is the Seawall from Olympic Village through to the improved Seaside Greenway along Pt Grey Rd. Currently focusing on the section from Burrard Bridge, around Vanier Park, through Haddon Park, Kits Beach Park to Trafalgar. Changes to date are a huge improvement; Charleson St changes are particularly appreciated. Joint letter from HUB/Kits Point Residence Association was sent to the Park Board, and the fence at Balsam St. has been taken down. We are hoping further improvements at this corner will be undertaken sooner rather than later. Successful media event on Saturday, July 15th to bring attention to the poor conditions through the parking lot at Kits Beach. A reminder to say thanks to the City and Park Board for these actions and the Searce and Searce	
Arbutus Greenway (Stan)	 for these changes. Former railway line from the Fraser River through to 1st Ave at Granville Island. Easy grade through some very scenic areas with easy access to shops and services. Temporary path complete; crossings being improved, but some still need work (e.g. 41st Ave). Lots of anecdotal positive comments. Draft plans for the permanent scope should be ready in October. Possible assessment ride in late August/early September. 	Stan: schedule follow-up assessment ride
Broadway Subway (Jeff for Anthony)	 Working group looking at the extension of the SkyTrain from VCC Clark to Arbutus St. Currently in planning stages. TransLink projects construction will start in 2019. Currently bikes may be permitted at off hours only due to space on trains (unlike the Canada Line). In a workshop meeting with TransLink, and City officials, HUB raised the issue of multimodal travel, and expected impacts during construction. HUB also expressed specific concerns about the impact on the bike routes on 10th Ave and 7th/8th Aves during construction. Station designs will be like the Evergreen Line for comparison. 	

Need to consider the future potential of Broadway	
for cyclists and pedestrians.	

6. City Consultations (Jeff)

- Highlights:
 - 10th Ave Bike Route City has just started workshops on way finding signs for the Health District.
 - Transportation 2040 Stakeholder Update Meetings held monthly.
 - Strathcona BIA Transportation Advocacy Plan (Gore to Clark on either side of Hastings St.) The BIA is interested in doing assessment rides in the area. HUB has a number of suggestions.
 - SW Marine Drive improvements Not to AAA standards, and there have been many issues noted with respect to concrete barriers, bike lane width, and dangerous crossings and corners. Jeff will post the independent auditor's report on our wiki.
 - Bike Route Inventory not discussed.

7. Communications (Jeff)

- Mosaic bike route at Woodland and Grandview Concerns that it is becoming more difficult to cross Grandview; mixed opinions from meeting attendees on this, some felt it hadn't changed over time.
- Union/Adanac bikeway at Vernon temporary road closure. Concerns that cyclists are now moving through too quickly. Discussion about whether the stop/yield sign should be on Vernon.
- New plaza at Bute and Robson looking for feedback on ease of bike travel through this area.
- 7th Ave near Granville busy with cars, and narrows just went of Granville; agreement on need for traffic calming, particularly with upcoming subway station construction.
