1. Welcome & introductions.

c. Tony attended a virtual meeting with MoTI regarding the 264 St to Sumas highway and overpass improvements. In the preliminary April meeting, the discussion revolved around how cycling advocates envision the inclusion of triple A cycling facilities on the overpasses and on bike routes running east/west parallel to the highway. The August 3 meeting focused on cycling infrastructure for the highway crossings. It must be noted that all crossings will not be replaced, some will receive upgrades. Design of the on and off ramps will determine whether MoTI can build uni or bi-directional protected bike lanes. All stakeholders present spoke strongly in favour of uni-directional protected lanes and intersections that reduce or eliminate the chance of motorvehicle/cyclist conflicts. It was pointed out that dedicated light signals for cyclists can help mitigate accidents. We look forward to meeting with MoTI before the end of the year.

- a. Committee members have been discussing end of trip bike parking and the inclusion of bike parking at new developments. Recently, John shared a link to a Dero webinar dealing with secure bike parking.

- b. HUB has announced that memberships will change from annual to lifetime effective September 17, 2021. The lifetime amount will be \$10.
- c. The UBCM (Union of B.C. Municipalities) held a Virtual Conference September 15, 16. where they passed a resolution asking the provincial government to amend the Motor Vehicle Act by requiring drivers to provide 1 meter of space at speeds 50 km/h or less, and 1.5 meters of space at speeds in excess of 50km/h, when passing people cycling or walking.
