Bike Repair Options for South Delta

Mobile repair



Various mobile operators operate in the region, including:

- **South Delta Bikes** (<http://southdeltabikes.com>), run by David, a local who previously owned a bike company. He can either go to customers to do repairs or do the repairs at his business.

- **velofix** (<https://www.velofix.com/services/>). velofix is a Vancouver-based franchise. The mobile repair service comes to the client; it is interactive, and bike owners can watch and learn. All bookings are made online. Payment includes a flat fee for their travel.
