A. Introductions

- 1. Patrick Interim Chair, South Delta HUB Committee

- 8. Jennifer (Delta Council candidate) Would like to promote better cycling connections and facilities, including River Road and Massey Tunnel Replacement project
- 9. Nicholas (Delta Council candidate) Grew up cycling in Ladner; views cycling as an important form of active transportation
- 10. Heather (Delta Council candidate As previous Councillor, was the chair of the former Traffic & Safety Committee; resulted in a comprehensive report from Urban Systems to improve connectivity between 3 communities of Delta; interested in reviving of the Traffic & Safety Committee
- 11. Karon (ICBC Road Safety Coordinator) Works on a road safety campaign, which considers cyclists and others to be "vulnerable road users"
- 12. Roel Interested in improving safety for cyclists, including bridge to Westham Island and River Road; recently began cycling again, for health benefits relating to arthritis
- 13. John Active South Delta cyclist; previously part of Vancouver Trails Committee
- 14. Elizabeth Interested in cycling for fitness; concerned about local connections particularly 56th and 52nd Streets in Tsawwassen
- 15. Bryan Cycles for health benefits (re arthritis); previously a resident of Whistler, where he was involved with trail development with municipal Parks & Recreation Committee
- 16. Graham Active cyclist; interested in cycling safety, including separated paths; concerned that development is occurring and cycling conditions are being left-out; also concerned about the safety of cycling lanes on South Fraser Perimeter Road; experience cycling overseas (Sweden) where cycling routes were separated, well-lit, and well-used
- 17. Dirk Promotes adaptive bicycles for those with disabilities; interested in bringing multiple users into consideration for paths; feels that the flat topography of South Delta could be a strong feature for tourism
- 18. Arno Schortinhuis Involved with HUB (former director); works with advocacy team behind Great Blue Heron Way, connecting TFN with adjacent communities and First Nations.
- 19. Kathy Frequently rides between Ladner and Tsawwassen; concerned about Arthur Drive (shoulders are crumbling), and poor state of River Road for cycling (part of dike is obstructed by a fence at the fish plant); feels that current Delta Routes Map is misleading as it leads riders into unsafe areas
- 20. Jack Cycles in Ladner; recently retired and interested in contributing to cycling improvements

21. Joann - Lives in East Ladner; very interested in evolving Highway 17A into more of a 'greenway', heading from Ladner to Tsawwassen/BC Ferries (similar to greenway in Richmond); experience cycling overseas (Netherlands), where citizens could cycle everywhere

Role: Act as the contact for the media – familiar with the activities of the committee, media contact policies and cycling issues generally

D. Upcoming Project: Delta Routes Map revision

Hon Yee and Steven Lan of the Delta Engineering Department have been in contact with the Committee to provide feedback on the upcoming Delta Routes revision (in particular, the identification of key destinations and routes between the them). Delta just released an RFQ (Request for Quotation) for the updated map, requesting consultants to submit bids by November 21st.

I. Comments:

Dirk – Suggested it would be helpful to have a map to draw on during the Committee meetings; this could become a living document for the Committee

Jack – Referred the Committee to Open Streets Maps, an online application that allows for mapping collaboration

Colin – Mentioned that many Committees use Yahoo Groups to collaborate amongst Committee (or Sub-Committee) members

Kathy - Referenced other route maps (in particular, Skagit County) which includes the "quality" of the roadways for cyclists, so that users won't be mislead into levels of safety that aren't there yet

2. Next Steps:

- → Form Sub-Committee/working group for Map Revision Project
- → Sandra has volunteered to lead the Sub-Committee (she previously prepared the 2004 & 2007 Delta Routes Maps; not bidding on new contract)
