

⇒ **ADVOCACY** to improve & promote cycling in Delta




Ciclismo en Delta



Leyes para ciclistas

- Ceda el paso a los peatones
- Deténgase en las luces rojas del semáforo y las señales de pare (STOP)
- Circule en el sentido del tránsito
- No use las aceras
- Use una luz delantera blanca y una luz trasera roja por la noche
- Utilice el timbre para indicar su presencia

Consejos prácticos para dar vuelta

Mirar por encima del hombro al vienen autos y señalar antes de dar una vuelta o cambiar de carril. Verificar nuevamente para asegurarse que es seguro avanzar.

Usar las señales manuales para indicar a los conductores hacia donde se dirige.

No cambiar de carril bruscamente. Señalar con anticipación hacia dónde va antes de dar la vuelta.

Si resulta incómodo cambiar de carril o dar la vuelta, defienda a un lado y esperar a que pasen los autos.

CASCOS

- Usar un casco siempre que se circule en bicicleta
- Amarrar siempre la correa bajo la barbilla
- Cambiar el casco después de un accidente o cuando tenga señales de daño.



Delta HUB Committee:
Feedback on Option Analysis for Port/MoTI Truck Staging Facility

Context:
The Port of Vancouver and the BC Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (the "proponents") are building a new Truck Staging Facility and Inspection area in South Delta. The location of the new facility will be at Deltaport Way and Hwy 17A, just west of Hwy 17 (SFPR). In connection with this project, the proponents are looking to realign/remove an existing bicycle path that was constructed when the SFPR was built.

To provide information and feedback, the following outreach has taken place:

- On July 6, 2016 Delta HUB was contacted by the project team overseeing the new Truck Staging Facility.
- On July 14, 2016, Delta HUB (Patrick Thompson, Sandra Jones) met with representatives of the project team at the Port Community Office in Ladner. The project team includes representatives from the Port, MoTI and consultants ISL Engineering.
- On July 18, 2016 Delta HUB provided the project summary and feedback request to its members; in addition, comments were sought from members of the South Delta Riders, Team Coastal, and the Boundary Bay Cycling Club.
- On July 20, 2016, the Delta HUB Safety/Routes sub-committee met in Tsawwassen to review the project and provide feedback. Attendees included Sandra, Anton, Roel, Matthias, Neil, and Patrick.
