4. Announcements (see bikehub.ca – updated regularly)

- Thanks to everyone who volunteered at Bike to Work. New records were set for participants and memberships!
- Bike to Shop coming up August 13th. See agenda item 5.
- TransLink funding announced for cost-sharing with municipalities. CoV received funding for the Burrard/Pacific intersection upgrades. The City will now be able to invest some of those municipal funds in other projects.

- Mayor's Council Phase 1 funding announced: includes commitment to secure bike parking at certain transit stations. Focus will be Evergreen extension and Canada Line. We expect it to be similar to the bike parking at Main and Terminal Stn.
- Velopalooza festival is underway (velopalooza.ca).
- Cyclehack is this weekend. Stuart attended last year and shared his positive experience. (cyclehackvan.tumblr.com)

5. Bike to Shop Day Presentation (Jessica)

- When: Saturday, August 13, 11am to 3pm.
- Goal: encouraging the use of bikes as transportation and also for running errands.
- Inspired by San Francisco Bike to Shop Day. In San Francisco, businesses seemed to believe that biking to shop was inconvenient and uncommon. The event was able to prove this assumption wrong.
- HUB will be hosting Celebration Stations in the Downtown area, on a similar model to BTWW. The Downtown BIA, Gastown BIA, and Hastings Cross BIA have sponsored the event.
- Working to get a pop-up bike lane along Hastings from Victory Square to Hornby.
- Activities include free bike mechanic services and education demonstrations.
- On Aug 10th, there will be a media event including a bike to shop 'scavenger hunt' around Gastown shops.
- Themes: Sweet Tooth Ride (family friendly), Pet Parent Ride (please let Jessica know if you know any one who rides with their pet), and Picnic Lover Ride, which will end with a picnic.
- Aiming to have 20-30 participants on each ride. HUB needs people to volunteer to support instructors on the ride, as well as one more primary instructor. Email jessica@bikehub.ca if you're interested.
- HUB is still looking for contacts at businesses that fit in with the themes. Let Jessica know if you have any.
- North-South extent will be from Downtown to Broadway.
- Working on creating a Discount Map: a passport for riders to explore businesses offering discounts on Bike to Shop Day.
- Jeff mentioned rewarding shops such as Bandidas Taqueria for their support of creating better cycling infrastructure on the Drive.
- Discussion followed on the economic potential of making it easy for cyclists to access businesses.
- There was discussion about educating people on ways to transport things by bike.
- Jeff encouraged committee members to volunteer for this event, as it is all within the City of Vancouver

Let Jeff know if you are interested in organizing and leading any of these. • Clark would like to organize a ride down Gore St. • The group just completed the King Edward Ave 	The working group is deciding which rides to schedule next.

Seaside South (Lisa)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working Group focus is the Seawall from Olympic Village through to the improved Seaside Greenway along Pt Grey Rd. • Currently focusing on the section from Burrard Bridge, around Vanier Park, through Kits Beach Park to Trafalgar. • The Seaside greenway is meant to be AAA (All Ages and Abilities). • The working group has been in communication with Park Board for about a year. • Report of this assessment ride is nearing completion. • ATPC put through a motion to Council on the need for improvements on the Vanier/Kits sections. • The path under the Bridge is First Nations land. There is a conflict because of the limited width. • Improvement is necessarily incremental. • Concerned Kitsilano Residents facebook group has threatened legal action to prevent improvements to the sidewalks along Point Grey Road from Macdonald to Alma. Destination Streets (Jordon)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This working group is advocating for infrastructure along destination streets with a high concentration of businesses and shops, and working with businesses & BIAs who often have concerns about bike lanes without knowing all the facts. • Ride notes and video have been prepared following the Main St assessment ride. The report is in progress. • Looking to make the report more accessible and reference some community plans relevant to the suggestions. • The group is thinking of doing a ride on Commercial Drive next. 	<p>See Jordon or Jeff if you are interested in participating in this group or would like a link to the video.</p> <p>Let Jordon know if you want to help complete the report or provide input.</p>
Arbutus Greenway (Jeff for Stan)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Old railway line from the Fraser River near Hudson through to 1st Ave at Granville Island. Easy grade through some very scenic areas with easy access to shops and services. • There was a document drafted by the group recently on project values and principles. The draft was circulated at the meeting. • It is anticipated that there will be a conflict of 	

	space as the City tries to keep the options open for a future tramway on the corridor.

- Meetings with VPD re: ticketing riders during BTWW for not wearing helmets. VPD did not have a campaign to target people not wearing helmets at this time. The meeting was a positive step. The VPD is given regular priorities from the City based on complaints. Colin brought up a report that another city’s cycling group did for police officers to educate them on what to watch for.
- Widened Seawall under construction near Creekside Park.
- Park Board working group for Dogs in Parks: coming up with a strategy of dogs and people sharing parks space, including people using active transportation. Anthony has agreed to be our rep on this working group.
