ATNP Support and Feedback for the Active Transportation Network Plan - The City is seeking volunteers to participate in a video to promote the ATNP.

Action: Damian is interested in participating in the promotion. Fulton will connect Damian with Cathy.

Ministry of Transportation and Transit (MoTT) Meeting re Howe Street MUP - Andrew F attended the meeting and is generally happy with the plan. He requested signage for drivers making them aware of cyclists and pedestrians. MoTT will ask cyclists to dismount where the route crosses the 91A Highway on-ramps and off-ramps instead of using elephant fee markings.

Victoria Street and Lorne Street Development - Andrew F noted that this new development may offer opportunities for a bicycle route connection to Seventh Street and Agnes Street.

Connection from New Westminster to Burnaby Midtown Greenway - Mike Anderson responded to Robert and indicated that the route is on the City's radar but not currently a priority.

Action: Robert will connect with HUB - Burnaby about the route.

Youth Advocates - Although HUB chose Lord Kelvin Community School to establish a bike bus, there isn't a parent with the school who is willing to organize one. Damian is torn between accepting HUB support for the bike bus at Skwo:wech Elementary School since it is already operating.

Bicycle Rescue Service Update - Gordon H and Fulton are working on the backlog of applicants for refurbished bicycles from last year and have received new applications. Donations of used bicycles are welcomed and can be dropped off at Cap's Bicycle Shop.

ATNP Support and Feedback for the Active Transportation Network Plan - The City has received feedback from the public about its plans for the Seventh Street Corridor and has amended its design to remove a planned diverter at Fourth Avenue and to retain more vehicle parking.

HUB-NW has advocated for a more gradual bicycle route by Ecole Qayqayt Elementary to bypass Merivale Street. The developer of a project on the east side of the school has agreed to the pathway.

Anecdotal comments indicate that usage of the Lime bike share is higher than was expected.


HUB SD40 Bike Friendly Buildings Report - Andrew will meet with a staff member of School District 40 to discuss the report, which highlights cycling deficiencies with the

schools in New Westminster. Damian and another parent will be leading a bike bus at Skwo:wetch Elementary School that will bring students to the school by bicycle.

Bike Parking in Shopping Districts (6th Street and 12th Street) - Steven Mater, Transportation Planning Analyst, CoNW, responded to Robert. He indicated that the City is open to installing more bicycle racks and requested location suggestions.

Youth Advocates - Claire highlighted that NWSS is hosting events (April 7 - 11) to encourage students to bicycle including having Gordon Hobbis serve as a bike mechanic on April 7 & 8. Participation in the events can be tracked using HUB's ride log or GoByBike's website. Claire is seeking support to pay for expenses and rewards. HUB will provide some financial support.

Burnaby Survey - The City of Burnaby is seeking feedback on its Southeast Bikeway Upgrade Project. Damian noted the route that connects to 12th Avenue is overly steep and gravelly.



Construction & Flagging Issues - A bi-directional bike lane along Sherbrooke Street (near Royal Columbian Hospital) is being installed. Damian noted that Keary Street is a better route than Sherbrooke Street to cycle uphill.

Stewardson Way New Bike Infrastructure - The new facility is open.

Communicating Support for New West Bike Lanes - Members were encouraged to counter negative comments about cycling.

2025 Action Plans - Individual HUB-NW members have been encouraged to work on their own bicycle-related action plans. Also, HUB-NW will continue to support the City's implementation of Active Transportation Network Plan by participating in the City's consultation process.

ATNP Support and Feedback for the Active Transportation Network Plan - The City will shift the location of the bike lane along the East Sixth Avenue by təməsewtxw Aquatic and Community Centre to free up more roadspace. Concerns with the connection of the Crosstown Greenway (behind təməsewtxw) to Cumberland Street were raised. Construction of the bike route along Seventh Street is expected to begin in the spring. The reconfiguration of the BC Parkway along Stewardson Way is nearly complete. Construction along Sherbrooke Street and Fader Street is impeding use of the bike route.

Action: Heidi will talk to the construction companies operating at Sherbrooke and Fader.

Communicating Support for New West Bike Lanes - Shane countered anti-bike sentiments concerning the Belmont Plaza, which is not a bicycle project.

West Point Cycles has produced videos available on HUB Cycling's Instagram (@hubcycling) that address anti-bike complaints. Heidi suggests members experiment with Komoot as an alternative to Google Maps for bike route planning.

HUB SD40 Bike Friendly Buildings Report - Andrew and Damian have contacted members of the School Board about the report.

Youth Advocates - Heidi has contacted Mr Pistore, the sponsoring teacher of the Environment Club at New Westminster Secondary School. Damian is planning to organize and lead a bike bus at Skwo:wech Elementary School in April. Transportation issues will be discussed at the April District Parent Advisory Committee meeting.

Construction & Flagging Issues - Heidi and Andrew F met with Mike Anderson, Manager of Transportation, CoNW and Michael Nguyen, Senior Engineering Technologist, CoNW regarding non-compliance of construction companies with the City's Traffic Control Guidelines. Heidi suggested rewording the Guidelines to stress the importance of compliance. Mike noted that the City has blacklisted a company for repeated non-compliance and recommended reporting vehicles parked on bike lanes to Parking Services (<u>https://www.newwestcity.ca/transportation/parking-and-towing/parking</u>). Andrew F reminded Mike about HUB-NW's request for a more gradual bike route by École Qayqayt Elementary.

Bike Parking in Shopping Districts (6th Street and 12th Street)

Action: Robert will contact Steven Mater, CoNW about whether the City plans to install more bike racks.

Connection from New West to Burnaby Midtown Greenway - Mike Anderson responded to Robert's letter requesting an extension of the bike route along McBride Boulevard to Tenth Avenue to connect Burnaby to the new Pattullo Bridge. The project is not currently a top priority of the City.

Stewardson Way New Bike Infrastructure - Mike Anderson confirmed that weave gates to reduce cyclist - motor vehicle driver conflicts along the new bike route are not planned.

In Meeting Actions - Members searched grant sources for refurbishing bikes and experimented with Komoot for bike route planning. Cathy also recommended some grant sources.

3. Activities

Earth Day/Week Event at NWPL - Fulton connected the NWPL representative with Garey Carlson, who has offered to give a presentation about his family's local bike camping trips.

Climate Friendly Homes Tour (Saturday April 26) - Fulton has volunteered to lead a bike ride to the homes that are part of the tour. Volunteers are needed to help with the bike ride and tour.

Bike to School Week (June 2 - June 6) & Go by Bike Week (May 31 - June 6) - No new information

2025 Action Plans - Individual HUB-NW members have been encouraged to work on their own bicycle-related action plans. Also, HUB-NW will continue to support the City's implementation of Active Transportation Network Plan by participating in the City's consultation process.

Communicating Support for New West Bike Lanes - At a corner of 7th Avenue & 6th Street, Andrew counted 24 users of the NWSS Cycling Connector on Monday January 20 (8 am - 9 pm). Contrary to anecdotal comments and public belief, the bike route is well-used. He also noted that bike parking cages at NWSS had housed many bicycles. Andrew drafted a letter about his results for Mayor and Council and the New West Record.

HUB SD40 Bike Friendly Buildings Report

Action: Andrew will reach out to Tammy Dewar, Vice-Principal of Queen Elizabeth Elementary School about the report.

Youth Advocates - Ella has graduated from New Westminster Secondary School (NWSS). A new NWSS representative is needed to reactivate the group.

Damian has applied to HUB Cycling to set up a bike bus on behalf of Skwo:wech Elementary School. The School District has changed catchment boundaries. Children living between Cumberland and McBride will now attend FW Howay Elementary School instead of Skwo:wech.

Alison Gu, Burnaby Councillor, requested that Burnaby examine the feasibility of building a traffic garden (see <u>https://www.trafficgardens.com/</u>) where children can practice cycling skills.

Construction & Flagging Issues - Mike Anderson, Manager of Transportation, CoNW indicated there were no changes regarding the issues and the Traffic Supervisor of the CoNW could revoke permits of construction companies to operate.

Action: Heidi will set up a meeting with Mike Anderson and the Traffic Supervisor.

Bike Parking in Shopping Districts (6th Street and 12th Street) - Robert indicated there is a new bike rack by the tin soldier at the River Market.

Connection from New West to Burnaby Midtown Greenway - Robert suggests extending the bike route along McBride Boulevard to Tenth Avenue to connect Burnaby to the new Pattullo Bridge.

Action: Robert will contact Mike Anderson about the suggestion.

Stewardson Way New Bike Infrastructure - Weave gates along the new route are being considered to reduce cyclist - motor vehicle driver conflicts.

Action: Damian will examine design standards to find an alternative solution.
