
- Van Connect please report bike lane maintenance issues, particularly debris and flooding

Consultations – Bute St Greenway



- Public engagement process launched

- Follows temporary improvements, and major street utility work (summer 2022)
- Shore to Shore
- Connectivity to other cycling routes

- Public engagement process launched with several options for improved paths
- Round 1 Values Engagement report issued January 2022
- Round 2 Path Options (engagement now concluded). Report expected in February 2022
- Round 3 Preferred cycle path route, planned for spring 2022

Consultations – John Hendry Park Renewal Plan


- A new public engagement process was launched, following years of discussions on a park master plan.
- We attended a community briefing meeting, to review the draft plan, and provided feedback
- Phase 2 public engagement has ended. A revised renewal plan is expected in early 2022
- Note that the cycle path is proposed to be shifted away from the lake, to the edge of the park, along a line of trees. This is the BC Parkway. A new gravel path is planned to access destinations in the park.

Consultations – St George Rainway

- Phase 3 of the public engagement process has ended.
- Phase 4, with a preferred design, is expected in the spring of 2022
- Phase 2 themes that came out of the engagement:
 - Nature should lead the design this was the top item
 - Space for walking and cycling was second
 - Street parking was ranked 5th out of 6; space for car movement was 6th.


Consultations – Imagine West End Waterfront Plan

- Phase 2 of the public engagement process (listen and learn) has ended.
- Phase 3, with initial design concepts and ideas, runs from January to June 2022
- Phase 4 includes preferred concepts, and runs to 2023, when the master plan is expected to be completed and sent to Council and the Park Board for approval



Consultations – Chilco Water Supply Tunnel (Stanley Park)

- Public engagement process launched
- The tunnel is within Stanley Park
- We met with the project team from Metro Vancouver to discuss impacts to cycling routes in the project area
- At two of the three tunnel shafts, there will be detours. Walking and cycling paths will be relocated, and truck traffic will be managed.
- Construction is expected to run from 2022 through 2027

Consultations – CoV Transport Pricing Study

- This study is part of the CoV Climate Emergency Action Plan approved by Council
- It is evaluating potential road use fees
- The goals will be to reduce air and noise pollution, and carbon emissions, and increase the amount of road space for sustainable travel
- We participated in round 1 stakeholder engagement interviews in November.
- An update to Council is expected this spring

Consultations – Ontario Greenway

- Improvements are planned for the intersection of 1st Ave and Ontario
- We have asked the City to consider installing vehicle diversions between 49th and 57th, due to the number of vehicles travelling at high speeds
- The CoV Greenways plan (2020) shows potential improvements on Cambie between SW Marine Drive and Kent Ave.

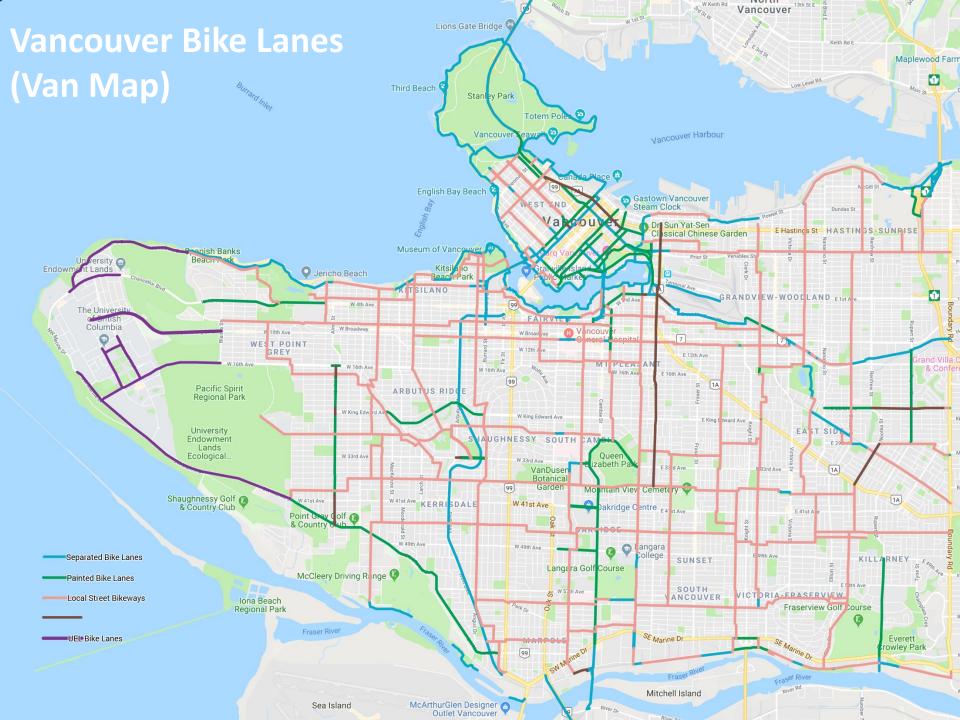


Breakout Rooms






Prototype Gap Map (Vancouver/UBC) with SoC Route Data (January 2022)







CoV Cycling Network Improvement Budget




CoV Cycling Map – Fall 2021 Update
