Hi Duncan,

I will put this on the agenda.

Our Committee can provide a single response, so it needs to be discussed at our meeting and then the results submitted.

It only has 12 questions on 1 page and only a couple require much discussion (basically the intersections needing cameras)

The 2 ICBC maps (Pedestrian & Cycling) will drive a lot of this.

Note the worst intersections have max 8 pedestrian & 10 cyclist incidents, vs the 1079 for the total crashes, so car-on-car are the vast majority, and many of these top car ones are not locations with a lot of cyclist (highway on/off ramps).

Regarding fatalities, 2 car drivers, 2 cyclists and 3 pedestrian died in north Vancouver (2019-23), so although car only incidents are much more common, vulnerable parties (cyclist and pedestrians) are much more likely to die (and probably also be injured), so intersections with larger numbers of vulnerable users need to be targeted as well a the locations with high # of car on car crashes.

Also 3 of the 5 fatalities (Cyclist & Ped) involved "Heavy Vehicles", and 2/5 were at intersections (I though this would be much higher)

This is NOT a general public survey, so only for discussion within the committee.
