


We now have a painted centre line along the full length of the Beach Ave Bikeway; solid near crossings and dashed in between crossings

Consultations – Jericho Lands Phase 3 Engagement

- The Jericho Lands are located immediately south of Jericho Park in West Point Grey, and are bounded by 4th Ave, 8th Ave, Highbury St, and Discovery St.
- 36 Hectares
- Owned by the MST Partnership (Musqueam, Squamish, Tsleil-Waututh) and the Canada Lands Company (a Federal Crown corporation)
- Build out could take 20-30 years




Consultations – Jericho Lands Phase 3 Engagement - Themes

Emerging Idea Themes



Prioritize Walking, Rolling and Cycling



- Prioritize active travel in site design, creating a network that is highly accessible and organic, modulating the surrounding street grid to respond to the site's topography and natural systems.
- Link the high and low points of the site with an accessible green corridor that integrates active modes.
- Design a highly walkable "15-minute community" by locating shops, services,

- and housing close to transit.
- Establish a fine-grained network of safe and convenient human-scale connections.
- Weave together a variety of experiences and destinations including gathering spaces, natural areas, and community amenities.
- •Create moments of tranquility in the landscape by providing quiet walkways through forested and naturalized landscapes.




Jericho Lands – Two Resulting **Transportation Networks**


Consultations – Smithe St Bikeway

- First Iteration (2016) partial protection at the east end of Smithe, with mixing zones at intersections
- Second Iteration (2018) elimination of mixing zones, additional paint, no additional protection

 2021 Construction is Underway – Full protection is being extended from Richards to Thurlow, bidirectional

New protected eastbound lanes are now being built on Pacific Blvd at Richards St, coming from Burrard and heading towards Yaletown




Consultations – Charles St at Nanaimo – Bike Path entry/exit

Consultations – Translink Transpo 2050

Some actions that have been included related to Active Transportation (cycling/micro mobility/shared)

- Develop the bikeway network, focusing on safe and comfortable bikeways in all Urban Centres and areas of high cycling potential
- Advance the implementation of a Regional Cycling Network
- Provide secure bike parking (racks, lockers, parkades) and charging stations for bikes, across the bikeway network, especially in urban centres and Frequent Transit Development areas, and at civic locations
- Require appropriate end-of-trip facilities at workplaces and other major non-residential trip-generating uses
- Program traffic signals on major bikeways and bicyclepriority streets to facilitate "green waves" to allow continuous travel



Transport 2050 Regional Cycling Network




BC Parkway and Central Valley Greenway Map





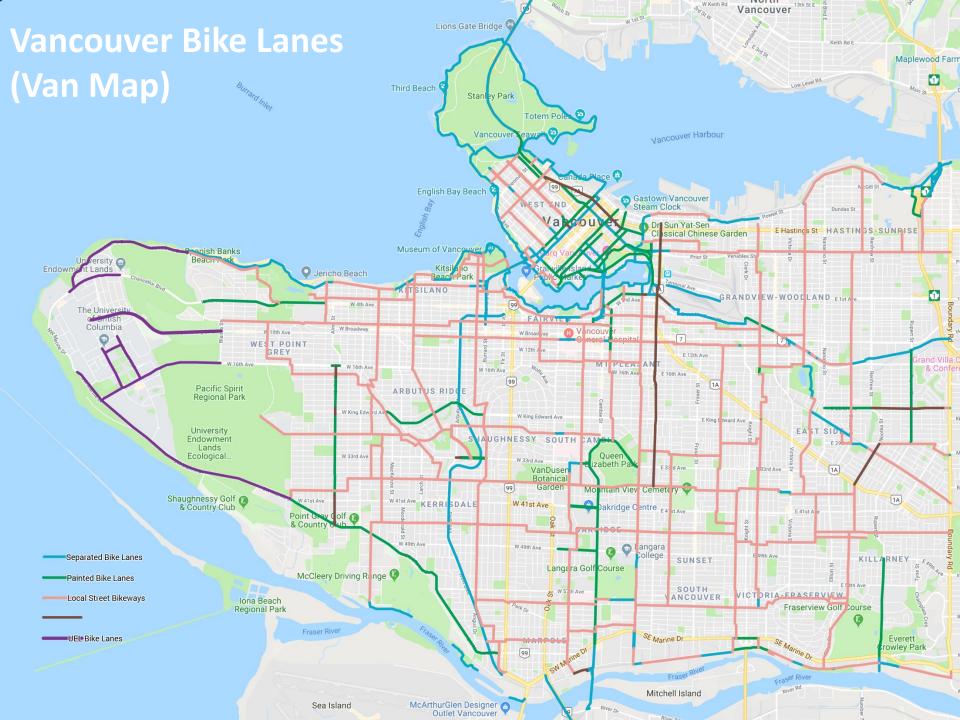

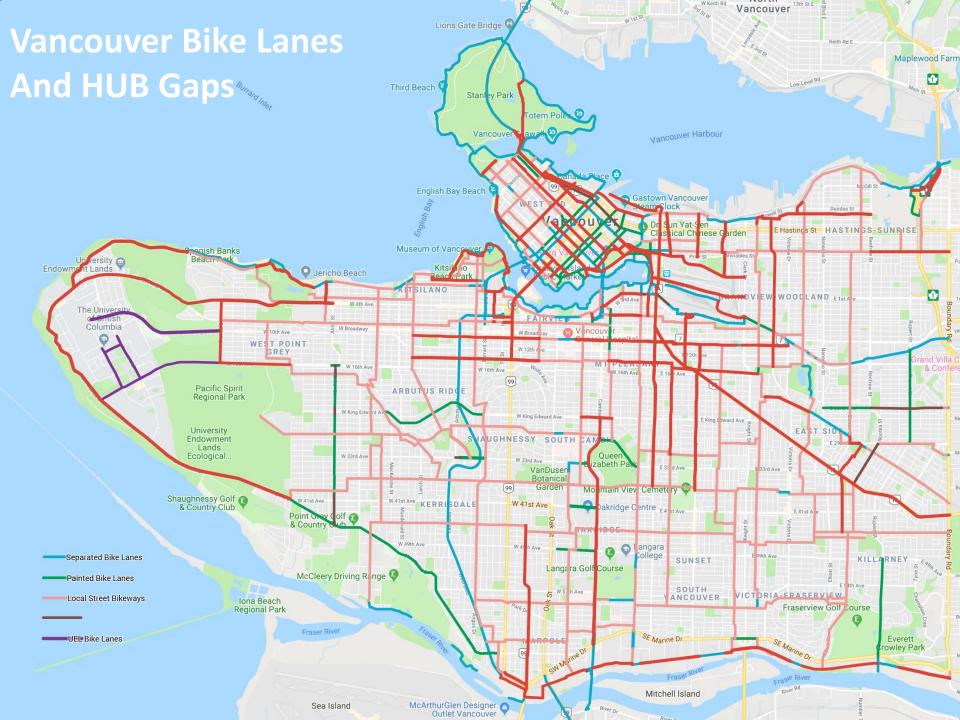








Prototype Gap Map (Vancouver/UBC) with SoC Route Data







CoV Cycling Network Improvement Budget



CoV Cycling Map – Fall 2020 Update




Translink Major Bikeway Network (MBN)
