7. Consultation/CoV Updates

- W 1st Ave EB detour between Columbia and Ontario. Following extensive discussions with Metro Van there will now be a more direct detour signed along Athlete's Way.
- Seaside Greenway Detour at East Park/Olympic Village is much improved.
- Crash involving a cyclist and a vehicle on a designated local street bikeway; VPD position on shared responsibility when a person on a bike is hit by a vehicle operator passing unsafely and in contravention of the MVA regulations on vulnerable road users. Several media interviews were held in response.
- Trans Canada Trail closed near IWMB. Property is owned by the railway. No short term resolution.
- Water St car light modifications, contra flow bike lane reviewed.
- Granville Connector Update. Not open yet, but getting close. Worker on site advised that they are just working through deficiencies.
- Victoria Drive signal light is expected to be active soon!
- CoV Transportation Day expected on July 9th
- Anticipated upcoming consultations

 - Civic District (including 10th Ave between Cambie & Yukon(
