The hospital does have a secure shipping container that is used for employee bikes. There are 2 sets of bike racks for the general public, however, they are sub-standard and located in low visibility areas. John has compiled a thorough document outlining solutions for bike parking at the hospital.

- a. John and Tony attended the online All Committee Workshop on October 28. Evan Hammer provided an update on the Transport 2050 Strategy and noted that the deadline for feedback would be October 29. Navdeep Cheema announced new insurance requirements for group rides. All group rides will require a trained group leader and a person with First Aid training. It is expected that HUB will provide the necessary skills training to interested committees next spring. HUB will provide trained leaders for any group rides that are planned before then. HUB invited speakers Burnaby Councillor Allison Gu, Kate Berniaz from MoTI and Stephen Hui from the Real Estate Foundation of BC to share their perspectives on building relationships with elected officials, staff and media through effective communication.
- b. HUB Langley will organize another Bike to School Week with James Kennedy Elementary School in Spring 2022.
- c. Jonathan Mak announced the launch of a Youth Advisory Committee for 2022. Each committee can nominate up to 2 students between the ages of 14-24 years.
- d. Mitch presented the City of Ottawa Protected Intersection Design Guide which was adopted on September 28, 2021. The purpose of the document is to provide guidance on the design of protected intersections in Ottawa.
