Thank you for your thoughtful comments and insights into active transportation infrastructure for the Surrey Langley SkyTrain (SLS) Project. You raise many points that we are attuned to as we begin to review options to integrate active transportation into the full 16-kilometre Project from Surrey to Langley, including applying the BC Active Transportation Guidelines, where possible. We are working closely with the Active Transportation team at the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure in this process.

The Project provides a variety of opportunities to improve the health and well-being of those in the region, and active transportation is an important part of that. The Province, which is delivering the Project, is in the process of design work (including the alignment and stations), environmental conditions, and other project details for the full 16-kilometre extension. More information on this reference concept design will be available in short order.

The Province appreciates the opportunity to work with organizations like HUB Cycling, as it has on the Broadway Subway Project, and we look forward to continuing that relationship on the SLS as the process evolves.
