- Information on supporting plans; mode statistics; safety hotspots; project highlights including the Granville Connector, Drake St., and Bute-Robson Plaza; and timeline for upcoming improvements.

9. Consultations Updates

- Stanley Park Mobility Study Final Stakeholder Meeting postponed to October
- Clark Drive at 10th Ave two crashes; <u>our letter with recommendations</u> including signal light timing; CoV response
- 14th Ave Bikeway Improvements Alder to Arbutus completion by Mid October; Prince Edward to Dumfries timeline TBC; Trafalgar to Arbutus will extend beyond 2027 due to signals
- Kits Park Protected Lanes construction has commenced
- East Park planning process concept plan due this fall
- Gastown Public Spaces design workshops held. Discussion on pushback from some businesses
- Dunsmuir/Melville Street Project to extend the Dunsmuir protected lanes to Broughton at the Seawall. The CoV has clarified that the block of Dunsmuir from Hornby to Burrard will be protected. We are requesting an extension of the Hastings protected lane one block west to Nicola, to connect to Nicola/Cardero/Georgia bike routes for faster commuters, instead of directing them to the often congested Seawall path. More details in the meeting presentation.
- The CoV has launched Digital Cycling Routes with map layers showing three popular routes (Stanley Park and Downtown; False Creek to Spanish Banks; East Van). The maps are all available <u>here</u>. Questions were raised on wayfinding signs. We support the <u>Translink Wayfinding Sign</u> <u>standards</u>, and have pushed for their inclusion in both the BC Active Transportation Design Guide, and on local projects.
- Granville Connector is progressing, with the north end of the bridge now reopened and construction advancing on Neon St at the north end, and the connection to the Arbutus Greenway at the south end.
