Updates from Working Groups		
Assessment Rides (Jeff, Philippe, Anthony)	 Assessment rides are reviews of existing or potential bike routes within the City of Vancouver (CoV). Reports are generated and posted on our wiki. Our reports are used to advocate with municipal officials and provide them with recommendations. Assessment ride of Richards St and Smithe St held, report completed and approved. 	Philippe: Complete report for the SW Marine ride

	 Assessment ride of SW Marine held, report in progress. Portside Greenway assessment ride held, ride notes completed. 	
Cycling in Parks (Lisa)	 Discussions continue with new Park Board commissioners on the Stanley Park interim protected lanes. There is a motion coming to PB on Dec 4th, but the motion has not been presented yet. Discussions with PB staff on progress on the Kits Beach park lanes, currently in design The new <u>East Park</u> in False Creek is going through a public consultation. 	
Arbutus Greenway (Stan)	 Former railway line from the Fraser River through to 1st Ave at Granville St. Easy grade through some very scenic areas with easy access to shops and services. Design work continues for the intersection of the AG and King Edward 	
Broadway Subway (Jeff and Anthony)	 Construction updates are being received from the project office and published through our social media feeds. Anthony will attend an upcoming stakeholder meeting 	
East Van Greenway (Clark)	 The creation of a north-south greenway in East Vancouver, eventually connecting Burrard Inlet to the Fraser River. Update received from the CoV; see presentation for details. Planning an assessment ride early in 2023 for the route through to the Fraser. 	
Municipal Election (Lisa)	 This working group prepared for the 2022 municipal election by creating a voting history record for incumbents and drafting questions that were posed to all candidates, with the responses published on bikehub.ca Presentation at the HUB All Committee meeting Dec 5 	

6. Consultations (Jeff)

- Strathcona Traffic Calming between Gore and Clark, and Prior and Hastings. Now being
 implemented, and monitored. See presentation for more details. The takeaway is that simply
 putting up signs for 30 km/hr is not considered effective, and the slides show the amount of
 redesign that is considered necessary to go along with a new 30 km/hr neighbourhood speed limit.
- An update meeting was held with CoV Engineering staff.
- Central Valley Greenway improvements are being implemented, and the City is monitoring the measures taken. Green paint has been applied. The curb cut at Clark Drive has been identified as an issue, and was discussed with the CoV who are following up.
- Portside Greenway improvement opportunity. We are pushing for the CoV to adopt this project as a
 major building block for 2023. We have received positive responses from both staff and elected
 officials. Building on our assessment ride, we are preparing for an upcoming public engagement on
 this route. See presentation for more details.
- Additional Pavement Markings on local street bikeways. Response from CoV staff is that simply
 adding LSB stencils is not considered as effective as roadway redesign to reduce vehicle traffic speed
 and volume. There are some strategic locations where additional green paint with sharrows may be
 useful, but not supportive of using it to demarcate all local street bikeways due to cost issues.
- Electrical box located in the new bike lane at 59th and Cambie. Response from CoV staff was that this is a project timing issue. The new lanes were built by the developer, and the signal control box was pre existing. On the list for the CoV to resolve.
- Granville Connector update. The construction contract has now been awarded
- Bicycle Parking, focused on the removal of parking meters and the installation of locking rings for secure bike parking. See presentation for more details.

- CVG Closure follow up. Discussions held with CoV staff, and a follow up meeting with key staff is scheduled to help ensure a better response in future in the event of a similar closure.
- We invited the CoV to attend an upcoming meeting and present on active transportation topics.
 City staff have suggested early in 2023, to cover both projects and neighbourhood traffic management.
