


Preparing for the Municipal Election

Municipal Election – HUB Platform

- Land Use
 - Sustainable land use plans, and complete communities
 - Reduce vehicle parking minimums
 - Support bicycle parking requirements
 - Equity in land use
- Infrastructure
 - Infrastructure, comfortable for all ages and abilities, to reach major destinations
 - Separation of modes
 - Each municipality to have a cycling plan
 - Cycle Highways

Municipal Election – HUB Platform

- Bold Steps
 - Increased budgets for Active Transportation infrastructure, education, programs, and promotion
 - Expansion of bike share and e bike share
 - 30 km/hr speed limit on all bike routes
 - Reallocation of road space for biking and rolling
 - Reduced on street vehicle parking
 - Support changes to the MVA that include safe passing distance laws, vulnerable road user protection, etc
- Social Equity
 - Prioritize investment in neighbourhoods that have historically seen less investment

Consultations – The Vancouver Plan

- A long-term strategy for growth through 2050, now approved by Council
- Two councillors have been in touch with us regarding moving ahead with active transportation improvements
- Discussion on ideas for priority setting in our discussions with the new council:
 - High Streets
 - Commercial Drive
 - School Streets
 - Others?

Consultations – The Broadway Plan

- The plan was passed by Council, with an amendment relating to adding in cycling lanes
- Staff will be going back to council in early 2023 to present alternatives on how this can be accomplished. This could include:
 - One vehicle lane each direction, with bike lanes and wide sidewalks
 - Two vehicle lanes each direction, with bike lanes and slightly wider sidewalks
 - Centre turning lanes
 - Bus stops
- We should be ready to campaign on this in the spring.

Consultations – Drake Street



- New protected lane completed from Burrard to Hornby
- New protected intersection at Hornby
- This lane will be extended east to Pacific, with timing coordinated with the removal of the Granville Loops



HUB Board Update

The HUB Cycling AGM is planned for Sept 29th. Voting for Directors and President is open to all HUB members, and will run the week prior to the AGM, online. Registration is required.

Other Business

- We are following up on our recent submissions to the CoV. We met with the new Manager of Transportation Planning, and plan to meet with the new Manager of Transportation Design.
- We are planning a CoV staff presentation at an upcoming local committee meeting, on current projects, and on a new approach to neighbourhood traffic management.


Breakout Rooms


Prototype Gap Map (Vancouver/UBC) with SoC Route Data (May 2022)


