Updates from Working Group Leads


- Assessment Rides Jeff, Philippe, Mike V. Kent Ave Bikeway proposal updated, approved, posted, and discussed with the CoV. CVG ride held, and draft report completed. Stanley Park ride held, and draft report completed. Future assessment rides?
- Cycling in Parks Anthony for Lisa Kits Beach Park and Arbutus St. temporary lane; Kits Beach Park paths; Stanley Park road reallocation.
- Arbutus Greenway Stan
- Cargo Bikes and Freight Sam
- Broadway Subway Jeff Detour implemented for the Arbutus Greenway from 10th to 7th for the next three years. City plans to protect 10th east to Cypress as part of the detour. Engagement with the Business Stakeholders Advisory Group, and Broadway Subway Project Traffic Advisory Group

Consultations – Stanley Park Temporary Protected Lane


 Motion to maintain the protected lane until at least July 2022 was passed. Staff report on longer term solutions due in early 2022.




- Public engagement process launched with several options for improved paths

- Ogden St was not included in the original project, but space exists on the roadway for the CoV to build a protected lane without encroaching on Hadden Park




ZONE 1 OPTIONS - Balsam St to Yew St



ZONE 2 OPTIONS- Yew St to Arbutus St and Creelman Ave






ZONE 3 OPTIONS - Arbutus St from Creelman Ave to McNicoll Ave




OPTION F - 'In-park' cycle path






OPTION G - Protected cycle path on Arbutus St



Consultations – Imagine West End Waterfront Plan




- Masterplan to address

- Workshops were held Oct 18-22



Consultations – Jericho Lands Phase 3 Engagement

- The Jericho Lands are located immediately south of Jericho Park in West Point Grey, and are bounded by 4th Ave, 8th Ave, Highbury St, and Discovery St.
- 36 Hectares
- Owned by the MST Partnership (Musqueam, Squamish, Tsleil-Waututh) and the Canada Lands Company (a Federal Crown corporation)
- Build out could take 20-30 years
- Survey has been extended until Nov 21




Continuous cycle path (eastbound) created from Burrard to east of Richards






Consultations – St George Rainway

- Project scope is from 5th Ave to Broadway, with a connection to the 10th Ave Bikeway
- Four street layout options have been presented, with a combination of vehicle diversions, street closures to motor vehicles, and parking reductions. All focus on active transportation. Option 1 is shown below, as an example.

The circulation system expands the pedestrian trail network and addresses current issues between active transportation and recreational trail users.

III E 14th ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION CONNECTION

· New link to existing route

15 MULTI-USE TRAIL TO COMMUNITY CENTRE

- · Shared recreational uses (walking, cycling, etc.)
- · Located to limit impacts on existing trees

IV END OF TRIP CYCLING FACILITIES

- · Covered secure parking
- · Bike pump station



III NORTH ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION CONNECTION

- · Link to Lakewood Drive route
- · Link to E 14th Ave. route
- Relocate 45 parking stalls from North Parking lot to E 19th Ave.

NORTH PARKING LOT

- · Market functions relocated to south parking lot
- 45 parking stalls relocated to E 19th Ave. to support Active Transportation Route Connection

18 PARK ENTRY FEATURE

- · Circulation hub
- · Seating, signage, park map

13 ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION ROUTE

- Dedicated cycling only route forming part of BC Parkway route
- · Low level lighting through park
- · Increase separation from lake loop

Consultations – Broadway Plan

- "Refined" Emerging Directions have been published
- Update from attendees at the Broadway Plan stakeholder meeting held this past week.

Consultations – Meeting with CoV Transportation Engineering

- 10th Ave Bikeway near Arbutus (AG detour)
- Intersection of Ontario and 1st Ave
- Pender Corridor options being considered (Hornby to Cardero)
- Portside Greenway engagement planned for Q1
- Arbutus Greenway connection to False Creek along Pine and 1st (interim)
- Kent Ave
- Parking Meter removals and plans for lock up points for bicycles (plan is for 33% conversion)
- Pilot program for reduced speed limits (Grandview Woodlands now, potential expansion to other areas)
- Stainsbury connection for the BC Parkway

Consultations – CoV Transportation Engineering

- Discussion on Ontario Bikeway between 49th and 57th, and the need for traffic calming with diversions (similar to Ontario near 33rd St.)
- Discussion on Slocan and 29th, connection the BC Parkway
- Discussion on School Streets and using infrastructure in lieu of volunteers
- Discussion on SW Marine and cycle lane barriers being shifted by vehicles
- Transport Pricing initiative
 - Part of the Climate Emergency Action Plan
 - Aim is to reduce vehicle use
 - Funding to support sustainable transportation modes

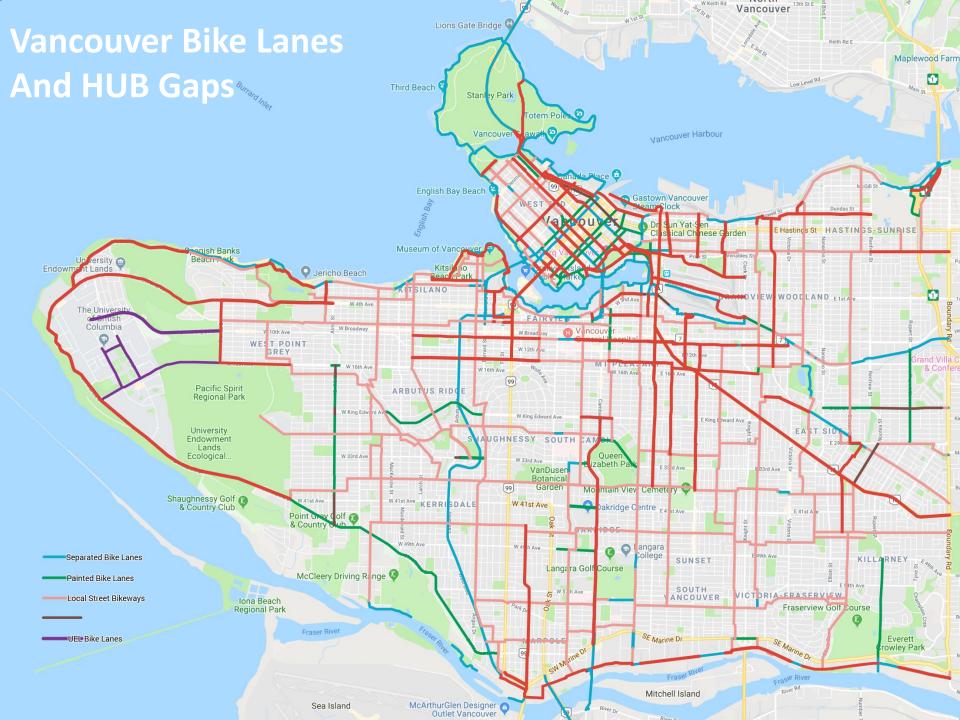








Prototype Gap Map (Vancouver/UBC) with SoC Route Data






CoV Cycling Network Improvement Budget
