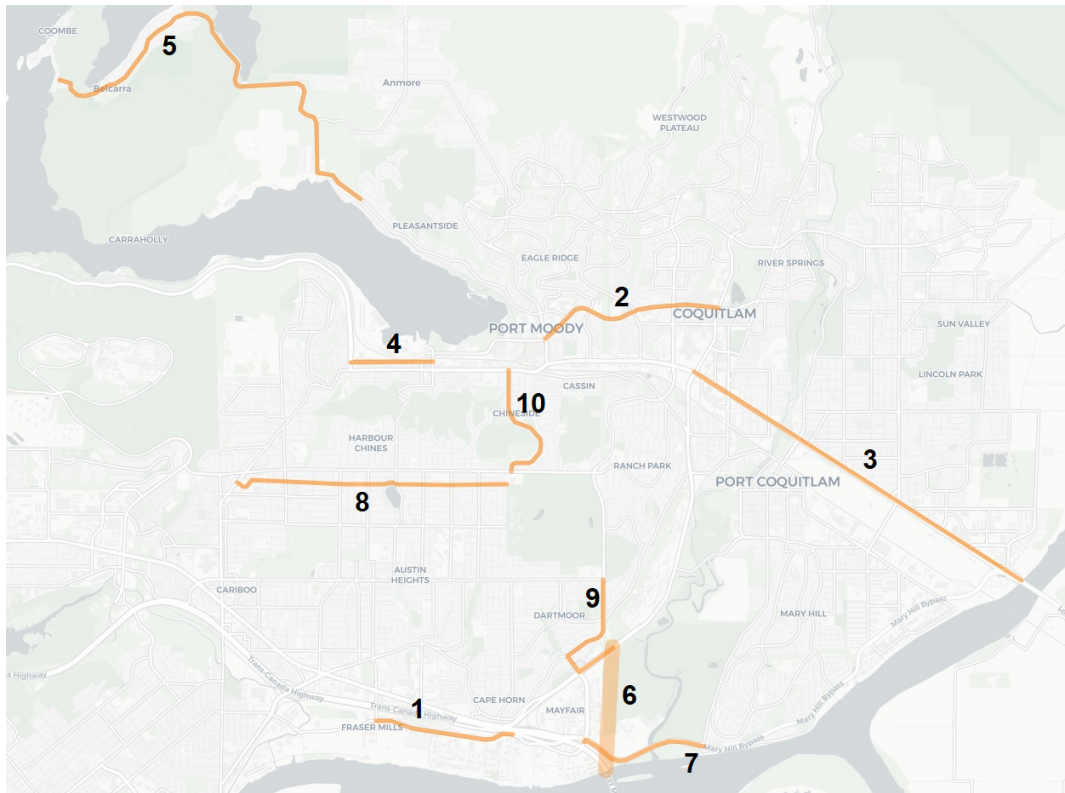
- semiqʷəʔelə (formerly Riverview) signage & pathway upgrades, Coquitlam, 2023

Top 10 Gaps

Note that our [full gap map](#) contains over 160 intersections and route segments in need of improvement – the map below represents our most active areas for advocacy.

1. Braid Station to Port Mann Bridge via United Boulevard, Coquitlam
2. Guildford Way from Pinetree Way to Ioco Road, Coquitlam/Port Moody
3. Pitt River Bridge to Coquitlam City Centre via Lougheed Highway, Coquitlam/Port Coquitlam
4. Clarke Street from Albert Street to Moody Street, Port Moody
5. Alderside Road to Sasamat Lake & Belcarra Regional Park via First Ave & Bedwell Bay Road, Port Moody/Anmore/Belcarra
6. Lougheed Highway at Colony Farm Road to the Port Mann Bridge, Coquitlam
7. Mary Hill Bypass from the Port Mann Bridge to Shaughnessy Street, Coquitlam/Port Coquitlam
8. Regan Avenue from Mundy Park to Burquitlam Station, Coquitlam
9. Mariner Way at Austin Avenue south to Lougheed Highway at Colony Farm Road, Coquitlam
10. Moray Street from St Johns Street to Como Lake Avenue via Thermal or Moray, Coquitlam/Port Moody
