Re: Thank You for the Brooksbank Avenue Road Safety Improvements

The HUB North Shore Committee would like to formally thank you for recent improvements made on Brooksbank Avenue. We understand that the intent of this project was to improve the condition of the road surface, so we appreciate you taking the opportunity to introduce much needed road safety changes. These improvements will make the North-South route between Keith and Main a much safer, more enjoyable route for cyclists. By encouraging more cycling trips, there will likely be less traffic congestion in the area and businesses may benefit from additional customers travelling by bike.

While the new bike lanes and bike boxes are significant improvements, we strongly recommend wayfinding signage be added to this route. [Wayfinding](#) should be a key deliverable of every project as it adds visibility to new routes and encourages people to use them. It will be important to coordinate signage across the District and City of North Vancouver, as the District is installing quite a bit of wayfinding signage as part of the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure's Lower Lynn projects.
