Re: The Proposed Redevelopment of The Bay Building

Dear Paul

We write to express our great interest in the proposed redevelopment of The Bay Building at Granville and Georgia. Specifically, we are excited by the potential for a Green Mobility Hub as part of this project, and a proposed secure 1500 bike parkade, with approximately 500 of those spaces set aside for the public, eg other than building tenants.

This building development proposal is remarkable in the focus on sustainable transportation connections, and the lack of vehicle parking incorporated. Given the significant lack of secure bike parking downtown, proposals by private developers that provide that type of parking are critical. We have reviewed the preliminary plans, including proposed street access to Seymour St, with a short connection to the Dunsmuir Bikeway. This bike ramp access for ingress, and motorized ramp for egress, is critical to the success of the bike parkade proposal in our opinion. We would like to understand the City of Vancouver's position on this aspect of the developer's proposal, and look forward to meeting to discuss it. We ask that you confirm which City departments are involved, and who can be involved in the discussion.
