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HUB Cycling Supports the City of Vancouver Granville Connector Project

The Granville Bridge Connector project is our opportunity to have a more interconnected city while working toward our new climate goals and emission reductions targets. We encourage our Mayor and Council to approve a bold design, which transitions at least two traffic lanes into a safe, accessible space designed for all people to enjoy and transit sustainably as we build the infrastructure for Vancouverites choosing to walk, roll, and bike.

In January, the City of Vancouver declared a climate emergency and is creating a plan to rapidly cut our greenhouse gas emissions 60% by 2030, with the goal of reaching net-zero emissions by 2050. To reach these deep reductions, we need a variety of solutions in support of our energy transition. This transition will require changing how we move through our communities to support sustainable modes for everyone.

This challenge demands creativity, courage, and community-led effort to build vibrant public green space, safe and enjoyable commuting networks, increased rapid and accessible public transit. These are only some of the solutions that, while decreasing emissions, will increase our collective quality of life.

Recognizing this, Vancouver's climate plan prioritizes walkable and complete communities, safe and convenient public transportation and transit, pollution free vehicles and buses. To reach our goals, we must work together to meet our 2030 goals to have: a.) 90% of people live within an easy walk and roll of their daily needs. b.) Two thirds of trips in Vancouver be by active transportation and transit and c.) 50% of the kilometres driven on Vancouver's roads be by zero emissions vehicles. If we are successful, we will be well on our way to reaching a 60% reduction of our emissions by 2030.

We support the approval and construction of the Granville bridge connector as a project that directly impacts our ability to meet these goals, while being a symbol of the healthy communities we can build through a meaningful transition.
