- Country club (Steveston Hwy) individual members have voiced opposition
- Transit Conversation (SFU study)
 - Barriers to transit: convenience or lack of, time (transit vs. driving), lack of space during rush hour, wait times for buses when there's multiple connections. Takeaway transit should be improved, people are more willing for something like the Skytrain when wait times are lower. We also don't allow pets on transit like Seattle does. Perhaps when non-rush-hour, they have a designated train to have animal riders.
 - Connections where main corridor is metro, then one connection via bus
 - Researchers are amalgamating everything, not sure what they're doing with the results. We've asked to be notified when the study is published.
- Richmond News opinions on Steveston Hwy MUP
 - Two opinions against, and two opinions support
 - Main concerns: cost and no one using it
 - Comments in the against opinion supported the MUP, showing support
- Update on RATC (Derek/Jesse)
 - No updates; RATC meets next week.
 - No. 3 Rd plastic delineators Jesse put in request to replace them after they were removed for repaving

- Update on Great Blue Heron Way (Sheryl)
 - No updates, no meeting in December
 - Regional Greenway 2050 Plan the Great Blue Heron Way (greenway, connecting the history and culture)) will be part of it. Currently the Great Blue Heron Way is a boardwalk. Intention is to build a (walk) bridge over Hwy 17. The hwy was cut through First Nations land. Elder Ruth would like to restore the connection and for trail to go along water, as First Nations have a deep connection to the water. Eventually, link Mud/Boundary Bay also.

- Update on council meetings (Sheryl)
 - Went to wayfinding engagement trying to promote destinations and tourism, greenways will be part of it. Cost factor too. Also QR codes for history, such as First Nations areas.
 - Nov 20 Active Transportation Committee
 - Dec 18 meeting
 - Submitted applications to the BC 24/25 Active Transportation Grant (one-off grants)
 - Aiming to remove extra lane along Westminster Highway near No 2 Rd, and putting in a bi-directional bike lane on the north side
 - Snow and ice response (question from Evan Dunfee) is city prepared to de-ice bike routes.. City had other priorities.
 - Proposal to reduce speed from 50km/hr to 30km/hr, bw Westminster and Granville, on No 3 Rd
 - Staff now doing a traffic study.
 - Let's Talk Richmond 5-year Financial Plan has been posted. Keep it in mind, if there's anything we're proposing, to refer back to the financial plan.
 - Developers can now forward \$ directly to the city to a pool of funds to use anywhere in the city instead of previously, where developers had to build infrastructure where their development was. City is also wanting to provide alternative transportation options such as bus passes and bike parking.
