The City of Maple Ridge has chosen to not build any more cycling-specific infrastructure, but rather to build (mostly bi-directional) MUPs "to kill two birds with one stone", i.e. to expand sidewalk coverage and separated cycling infrastructure at the same time. We hope to educate Council on the importance to carefully consider context for each project, and to ensure that the infrastructure built truly serves all ages and abilities, is safe, and actually leads to increased cycling participation.
